Why Assess Character Development?

- 5 short-answer observational questions.
- Designed for pre- and post-assessment.

Administering the Assessment



- Conduct assessment twice: before and after instruction.
- Encourage honest and thoughtful responses.
- Explain purpose to students—growth, not grading.

Likert Scale Questions (1-5)

- Students rate statements from 'Strongly Disagree' to 'Strongly Agree'.
- Measures self-awareness, management, decision-making, and relationships.
- Identifies areas of strength and improvement.

Short-Answer Questions

Provides deeper insight into student reflections.

Encourages

examples and
experiences.

Helps track qualitative changes in character development.

Scoring & Interpreting Results



- Compare pre- and post-assessment scores.
- Identify individual and group progress.
- Use data to tailor support strategies.

Using Assessment Data to Inform Teaching



- Integrate findings into lesson planning.
- Provide targeted support for struggling students.
- Encourage self-reflection and goal-setting.

Encouraging Student Engagement




- Foster a growth-focused classroom culture.
