Scenario:

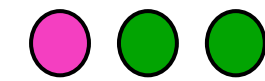

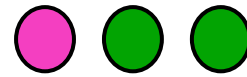
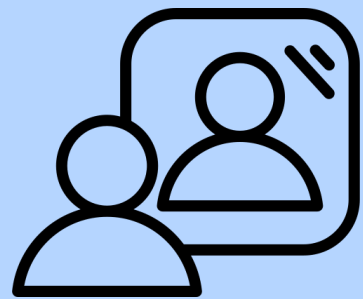


## Values

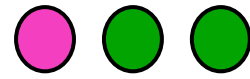
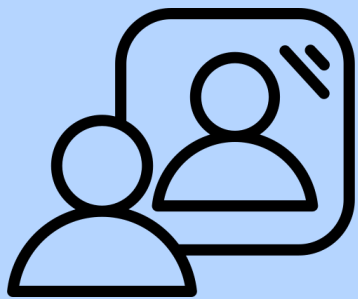
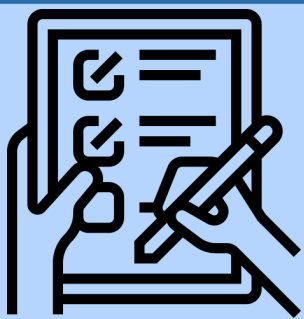
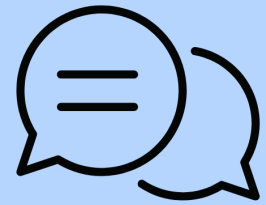
Some examples of values are honesty, fairness, and respect.
